A smarter and more convenient way to travel

SmartRider ticketing system is a smarter, convenient and more secure way to pay for your travel on Transperth services. The appropriate fare is deducted from the stored value on your SmartRider card when you tag off at the end of your journey. SmartRider saves 15% to 25% off cash fares every time you use public transport.

Cash tickets are still available for people travelling without a SmartRider card.

The Joondalup Line

Joondalup to Perth in less than 26 minutes

The Joondalup train line provides access for City of Joondalup residents and visitors to Perth city and a wide range of other destinations across the metropolitan area.

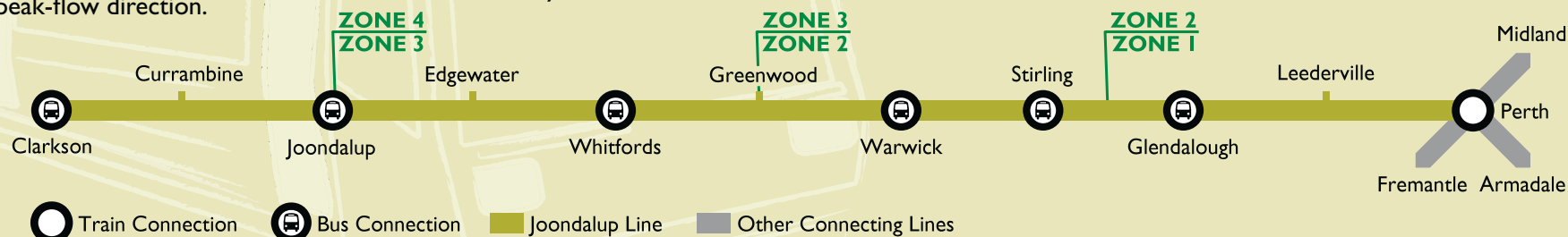
A 3 or 4 zone fare will allow you to travel from Joondalup line stations to a range of destinations such as Fremantle, Subiaco, Burswood, Cannington and even Scarborough via Glendalough Station. Transperth zone tickets are valid for 2 hours so you can spend about an hour in central Perth and travel home on the same ticket.

Joondalup Line trains run from 5:30am until midnight on weekdays and until 2:00am on Friday and Saturday nights, with services also running on Sundays and public holidays. Trains service major stations from just 4 minutes in peak periods and between 5-30 minutes during off-peak.



Catching the train is fast and efficient, with the journey from Joondalup to central Perth taking just 26 minutes.

Bicycles can be taken on trains free-of-charge, however, they are not permitted on services during morning peak (7.00am – 9.00am) and afternoon peak (4.30pm – 6.30pm) in the peak-flow direction.



TravelSmart

Local TravelSmart Map

TravelSmart is a local travel information service which assists households to change a few car trips each week to walking, cycling or public transport.

The Joondalup TravelSmart Map provides a range of local travel options, including information on the best way to get to local train stations. Many residents in these areas are within walking distance of a train station and, for those living further away, the maps also show the bicycle and bus routes connecting to Joondalup Line stations.



There are many benefits to selecting the best travel option for your trips. For example, catching a bus, walking or cycling to a railway station will give you a better connection with trains and allow you to avoid traffic congestion and parking costs and hassles.

Walking or cycling to the station is great exercise, will allow you time to plan or reflect on your day and to appreciate your neighbourhood as well as save you money.

Peak Periods

Plan ahead to select the best train service

Train services departing Joondalup between 7:00am and 9:00am during week days can be particularly busy. For a more comfortable journey and to avoid this busy time, consider travelling just 15 minutes earlier or later than these times.



Trains departing Perth can also be busy during the afternoon peak period between 4:30pm and 6:30pm. However, services are frequent and, if you would rather avoid this peak, it is unlikely you will need to wait more than 4 minutes for the next train.

The Public Transport Authority is currently working to address peak service congestion by introducing new seating arrangements, as well as longer trains to meet the increasing demand for services. The new train sets will commence service in early 2009. There is also high demand for car parking space at most stations. The local TravelSmart map highlights bus, walking and bicycle alternatives for getting to the train.

Major Joondalup Line Stations have Customer Service Staff available to assist you when trains are operating.
